The chart illustrates that $45.2 \%$ of students find the campus infrastructure to be good, with an additional $12.6 \%$ rating it as excellent. A significant portion, 23.1\%, deems it average, while 19.1\% express that the infrastructure is very good.

According to the figure, $28.1 \%$ of students think the cleanliness in the campus is very good, while $40.2 \%$ of students think it is good. A significant percentage, $15.1 \%$, think it's average, while $16.6 \%$ say the infrastructure is excellent.

According to the chart, $35.2 \%$ of students find the library facilities to be good, with $24.1 \%$ describing it as excellent. Additionally, $9.0 \%$ express an average opinion, while $31.7 \%$ consider it very good.

The chart illustrates that $37.7 \%$ of students find the canteen facility to be good, with an additional $8.5 \%$ rating it as excellent. A significant portion, $42.2 \%$, deems it average, while $11.6 \%$ express that the infrastructure is very good.


In the provided graph, the rating scale ranges from 1 to 5 , where 1 signifies the lowest and 5 the highest rating. Notably, $34.2 \%$ of students assigned the highest rating of 5 to teaching-learning quality, while $42.7 \%$ gave a rating of 4. An additional $18.1 \%$ rated it as $3,3.0 \%$ as 2 , and only $2 \%$ rated it as 1 . This indicates a positive perception of teaching-learning quality among the surveyed students.

8. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?



According to the figure, $30.7 \%$ of students think the facility of providing career counselling and guidance by college is very good, while $33.7 \%$ of students think it is good. A significant percentage, $14.6 \%$, think it's average, while $21.1 \%$ say it is excellent.

The chart says that a significant majority, $78.9 \%$ of students, says that over $80 \%$ of the syllabus is covered in their classes. In contrast, $17.6 \%$ feel that the coverage is between $60 \%$ and $80 \%$. A smaller percentage, $2.0 \%$, stated that only $40 \%$ to $60 \%$ of the syllabus is covered in their classes.

The chart indicates a positive perception among students regarding teacher preparedness, with $88.9 \%$ expressing that teachers are wellprepared for classes. A smaller percentage, $7.5 \%$, considers it average, while $3.5 \%$ believe teachers are underprepared. Overall, a significant majority acknowledges the preparation level of their instructors as satisfactory.

The chart illustrates that a majority, $63.3 \%$ of students, believe that the evaluation process by teachers is always fair. Additionally, 27.6\% perceive it as usually fair, $6.0 \%$ find it sometimes fair, and a minimal $1.5 \%$ consider it usually unfair. Overall, the majority expresses confidence in the fairness of the evaluation process.

11. College Encourage to students to participate in various programs such as student exchange programmes, internship...


The presented chart indicates that a significant majority, $66.3 \%$, reports that academic performance is consistently discussed with both students and parents. In contrast, $17.1 \%$ state that it is usually discussed, while $12.1 \%$ mention occasional or sometimes discussions. A smaller fraction, 4.5\%, notes rare discussions about academic performance.

The chart reveals a positive trend, with $50.8 \%$ of students affirming that the college consistently encourages participation in programs like student exchange and internships. Additionally, $24.6 \%$ state it happens often, $16.1 \%$ mention it occurring sometimes, while $6.5 \%$ note rare occurrences. Only a minimal $2.0 \%$ claim that such encouragement never takes place.

The chart indicates that nearly half of the students, $48.7 \%$, acknowledge that lecturers consistently provide information about course outcomes. A significant portion, $38.2 \%$, notes that this happens usually. A smaller percentage, $9.5 \%$, mentions occasional instances, while only $2.0 \%$ report rare occurrences of receiving information about course outcomes from their lecturers.

As depicted in the chart, a notable 54.3\% of students observe that lecturers consistently make efforts to assist academically weak students. Additionally, $35.2 \%$ state that this assistance usually occurs, while $6.0 \%$ mention occasional efforts. A smaller percentage, $2.5 \%$, indicates that such help is rarely extended by lecturers.

The chart illustrates a positive feedback regarding the encouragement of students to participate in extracurricular activities. A combined 85.4\% of respondents either agree (45.7\%) or strongly agree (39.7\%) that the college/department actively promotes extracurricular involvement. A smaller portion, $13.6 \%$, expresses a neutral stance, while only $1.0 \%$ disagrees with the encouragement.

The chart highlights a positive perception, with $72.4 \%$ of students affirming that the college and teachers actively impart soft skills and employability skills, preparing students for industries and entrepreneurship. While, $22.6 \%$ feel there is very little efforts, while a smaller $5.0 \%$ indicate that such skills are not imparted at all.

The chart indicates that $45.2 \%$ of students acknowledge that every time lecturers use ICT tools like LCD projectors and multimedia in their teaching. Additionally, $29.6 \%$ state that this occurs usually, $19.1 \%$ mention occasional use, while a smaller percentage, $5.5 \%$, reports rare utilization of ICT tools during lectures.
